The independence struggle in Western Sahara mirrors almost exactly that of the East Timorese. In 1975 when the colonial power, Spain withdrew, the neighbouring country, Morocco moved in. A bloody war ensued until a UN sponsored ceasefire was declared in 1991 when a referendum was promised. Since 1991 Morocco has rejected every referendum proposal and after 28 years of waiting there is still no resolution in sight for the 165,000 Saharawi people who are living in refugee camps in the harsh desert of western Algeria.
